Topic:	Node.js and Express

Overview

In this lab, you will develop a simple form handler in Node.js and Express, with a pug template for a form.

Instructions

The base files include a `package.json`, so you should only need to install the dependencies with `npm install`. Using the in-class examples as a guide, make sure that the following are working:

- Include the `express` plug-in
- The folder `public` is set to serve static files
- The folder `views` is set to serve Pug templates
- The `body-parser` plug-in is included, and invoked on all HTTP requests

Your application will have two routes, both to the URI `/checkUsername`.

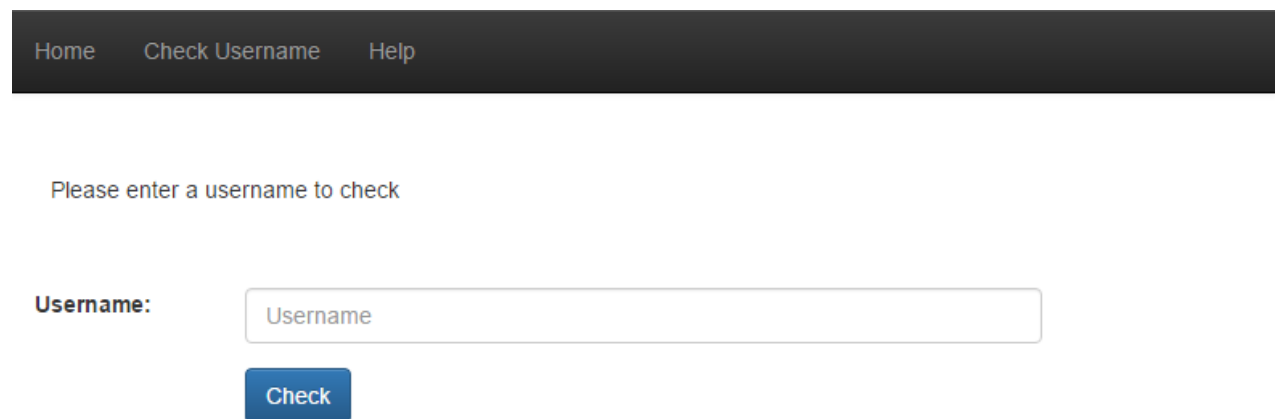


Figure 1: The form before any username has been submitted

The GET handler will render the `enterUsername.pug` template, passing the message ‘Please enter a username to check’

The POST handler will also render the `enterUsername.pug` template, but the message passed will be either:

- ‘That username is available.’: If the username that the user has entered is not in the list `['admin', 'bsmith', 'rfortier']`
- ‘This username already exists. Please try another.’: If the username that the user has entered is in the list `['admin', 'bsmith', 'rfortier']`

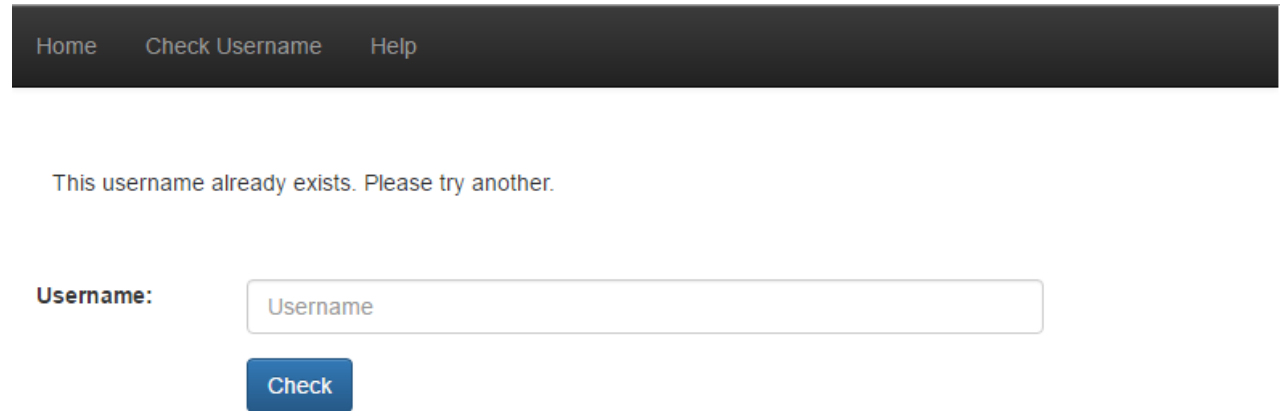


Figure 2: The form after the username ‘bsmith’ has been submitted

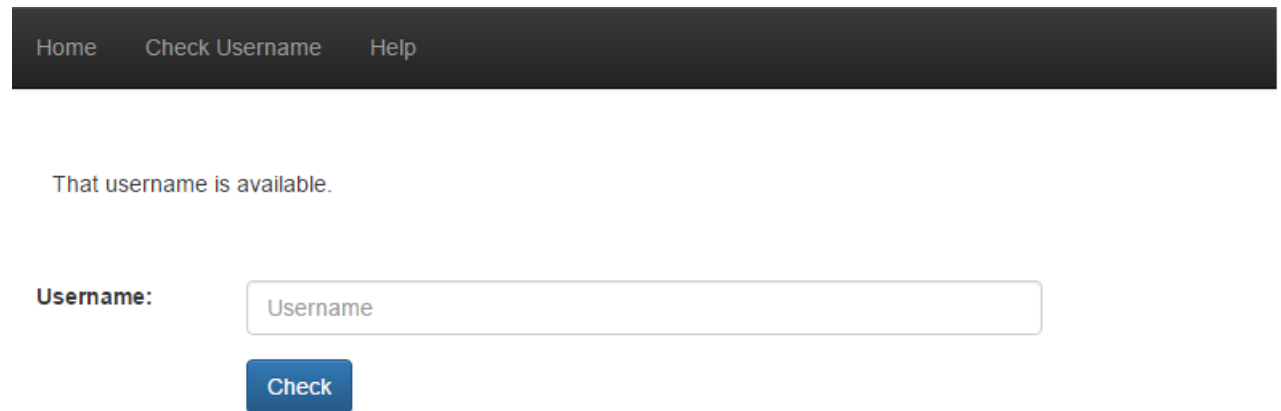


Figure 3: The form after the username ‘fred’ has been submitted

How to Submit

Submit the HTML, CSS, and JavaScript files in a ZIP file, with a name following the same pattern as previous labs: `Lab09_FirstNameLastName_StudentNumber.zip` (e.g. `Lab09_RandyFortier_100539147.zip`) to the TA.
